She tried to address this need by creating a religious order, the Josephite nuns, where they would go out to help the poor, educate them and try to improve their situation and life.

This is one of the main reasons why she was canonised. If you look at all the great people within history, they have all had a significant effect upon society. Mary MacKillop is certainly one of these people. Mary battled many hardships throughout her life. She suffered poor health was ostracised and even had a period of ex-communication from the Catholic Church. Throughout it all, she never lost faith in her own beliefs or her convictions that she was doing the right thing. Mary MacKillop is an outstanding example of leadership in action.

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**Class of 50 Year Reunion**

I had the privilege of joining the Old Collegians from the Year 12 Class of 1962 last Saturday night at their reunion held in the Old Collegians Pavilion. Whilst there were many stories regarding their time at St Patrick's College including a number of Christian Brothers who taught them in their time here, they had a genuine fondness for their time within the St Patrick's community. There were a total of 64 boys in Year 12 in 1962 and they were all housed in the one room which is now PEL010. There were approximately 300 boarders with a total student population of approximately 600.

In taking them on a tour of our current site they marvelled at the changes and facilities that are available to our current boys. Whilst not expecting that the school wouldn't have changed in the 50 intervening years, it took them some time to re-orientate themselves to the College. The O'Malley, Devine, Miller, Little and Wilding Wings did not exist in 1962.

Buildings that were familiar to them were the Chapel, Pell Wing, Purton Wing (formerly Boarding dormitories) and the Healy Wing (another boarding dormitory). They were amazed at the O'Malley Gymnasium, Pavilion and Kearney change rooms. They were all proud of what the school had become. The Old Collegians were fine examples of the reality and lived experience of our current vision statement "Raising fine boys to the status of Great Men."

I constantly marvel at the opportunities that are on offer here at SPC. The last fortnight provides a snapshot of some of the activities on offer. There have been a range of sporting activities ranging from football, rugby, soccer, hockey, cross country, table tennis, squash and basketball. I have probably neglected to name a range of sports but each of these sports have provided students with an opportunity to play in finals against other Ballarat schools, develop teamwork and build friendships with their peers. More detail regarding these activities is contained later in this edition of *The Crest*.

## Music

On August 15, 76 Music students will travel to Queensland to compete in two Music festivals. Firstly they will play at the Urban Upbeat Festival where they will entertain the crowds at the EKKA which is the equivalent to the Royal Melbourne Show. This is a warm up for the major competition which is the Catholic Colleges Music Festival. This festival is the National Titles of Music for Catholic schools and this year we will be the only school representing the State of Victoria. All States are represented this year. Many students will be competing a number of times in both the Concert Band and in smaller ensembles.

Groups representing SPC this year include: Concert Bands 1 and 2, Percussion Ensembles 1 and 2, Flute, Saxophone, Clarinet, Brass and Guitar.

## Parental Involvement in Boys' Academic Success

The academic staff continue to work hard in examining ways to provide the best possible Teaching and Learning for all boys enrolled at St Patrick's College. I am extremely confident that through the commitment of staff and the desire to provide the best education for boys in Ballarat, that the College will continue to refine its Teaching and Learning programmes and practices.

But what about the parents? Is there a role for them in all of this and if so, how can they assist in the academic journey and progress on their boys? The answer is, of course, yes – the role of parents in supporting students achieve academic success is very important. Many of you will have read and heard of our commitment to the partnership between home and the College in this important endeavour.

Below is a summary of some of the evidence supporting the notion that parental involvement is an influential factor in young students achieving academic success:

- Students from families with above-median parental involvement showed success rates 30% higher than those from families with below-median parental involvement.
- Where teachers reported high levels of outreach to parents, reading scores grew at a rate 50% higher, and math test scores 40% higher, than in schools where teachers reported low levels of outreach.

### Studies find that students with involved parents are more likely to:

- earn higher grades and test scores
  - pass their classes, earn credits and be promoted;
  - attend school regularly;
  - have better social skills, show good behaviour and adapt well to school; and
  - graduate and go on to further education.
- Programmes that engage families in supporting their children's learning at home are linked to higher student achievement.
  - All families can have a positive influence on their children's learning.
  - The research evidence is now beyond dispute. When schools work together with families to support learning, children tend to succeed not just in school, but throughout life. In fact, the most accurate predictor of a student's achievement in school is not income or social status, but the extent to which that student's family is able to:
    - Create a home environment that encourages learning;
    - Express high (but not unrealistic) expectations for their children's achievement and future careers; and

- Become involved in their children's education at school and in the community.
- Research shows that the number one predictor of students' academic achievement is their mother's educational level followed by the educational level of both parents.

This research was compiled by Dr John H Wherry, an experienced teacher in his own right and President of the Parent Institute in Virginia, USA. This week is a rich one in the Church's liturgical calendar. Monday was the feast of the Transfiguration, where the divinity of Jesus was revealed to Peter, James and John (Matt 17:1-13). But this was not done merely as a show of power but to be an invitation into our own destiny. To be open to the love and mystery of God is when our own nature will be perfected, through love, in the reward of eternal life. (Phil 3:21). God wants us to flourish in friendship, not be intimidated. Wednesday, August 8 was the Feast of St Mary of the Cross, Australia's first saint. I saw a quote recently that the Church does not make a saint, but recognises a saint. What we recognise in St Mary is best summed up by her most famous quote, "*Never see a need without doing something about it*". These two celebrations are not to be seen in isolation. In fact, I suggest that they are best understood through the light of faith in the Incarnation. Just as Jesus was fully human and fully divine so too we rise up on the wings of faith and reason (John Paul II). At Christmas we celebrate that "we see our God made visible and so caught up in the love of the God we cannot see".

This love is seen shining through the acts it inspires. This love gives us eyes to see the glory of the transfigured Jesus, but also the courage to respond to the needs of our neighbour in this world. The joy and challenge of a Catholic school is communicating the perfect unity of this vision. We echo St Irenaeus who, in the late second century, remarked that the glory of God is found in the human person fully alive. This week we have been given the chance to contemplate what "being fully alive" may look like.

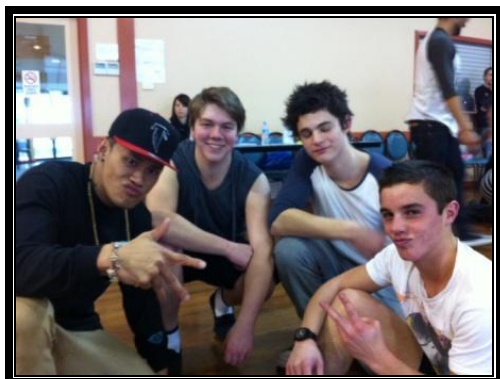


The Pre Tour Concert at the Wendouree Performing Arts Centre

## HEAD OF MIDDLE SCHOOL

Continuing the Middle School theme of helping the boys with Organisational and Study skills, Pastoral teachers have introduced further ideas to assist the boys. Below is a summary of steps which may be of use when revising both Maths and Non-Maths subjects.

### Steps in learning (Non Maths)

#### (1) Reading:

- Read the topic heading very carefully
- Read the introduction and summary of the article
- Re-read the first sentence taking notes as you go
- Re-read the entire article taking notes as you go

#### (2) Analysing Information:

- Analyse information into KEY and MINOR points
- **Key points** – always relate to the topic heading
  - always in the introduction and summary of the article

- **Minor points** – explain why key points are important

#### (3) Basic Note Taking:

- Make two column notes: Key Points and Minor Points

#### (4) Advanced Note Taking:

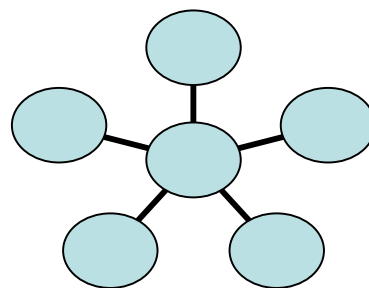
- Construct memory maps from your two column notes

#### (5) Applying the information:

- Textbook questions and answers
- Exam questions
- Class discussions
- Teacher/ study groups

#### (6) Memorising information:

- If less than 6 points – normal revision
- If more than 6 points – mnemonic sentences
- Learn key points well
- Learn information in layers
- Use **wall charts** – divide into Minor Points, Key Points



### Steps in Learning Maths

#### (1) Weekdays:

- Do your homework on the night it is given
- Chart your formulas
- Develop Maths revision cards: On one side Draw concept: Write Formula. On the reverse of the card put an example

#### (2) Weekends:

- Make one page chapter summaries, then
- Transfer your chapter summaries to your data sheet (Cheat Sheet), then
- Revise your previous chapter summaries, and
- Solve 10 short answer questions and 2 analytical questions

#### (3) Term Holidays:

- 8 -10 hours of problems to solve
- Update your Data Sheet (Cheat Sheet)

#### (4) Towards Semester Exams:

- Do trial exams under full exam conditions

### And remember:

- Whether studying English and Humanities, Maths or Sciences there are no shortcuts, you get out of it what you put into it.
- Constant Revision is the **most** important part of your work.

### St Patrick's College - 5 defeated by Haileybury College - 15

The weather may have been miserable but that didn't dampen the enthusiasm of our supporters, parent and spectators alike that had assembled to appreciate the game that had brought them all together, rugby union.

This occasion allows us to put rugby on show and unashamedly celebrate the game they play in heaven. Playing on Main Oval gives our supporters the chance to enjoy the game in comfort from behind the glass of the OCA Pavilion.

Coach, Mike Govers, took the boys into the change room and emphasised the importance of this game to secure a semi-final at our home ground. With that objective as motivation SPC lined up as Mitch Cattel took the opening kick off. The weather was atrocious and SPC were impressive with their defence and tackling and had denied Haileybury any real scoring chances early on the game. Jay John - Jack and Gene Bergman were impressive in the opening Stanza with their work around the breakdown.

The ball was proving difficult to handle in the conditions, on two occasions SPC got them selves into scoring positions only to be denied

by handling errors. Both teams would have been frustrated at half time with a score of nil all.

The second half was under way and Haileybury stole the ball at an early breakdown and scored a try from the resultant phases. This has been the Achilles heel of the 1<sup>st</sup> XV all year, conceding a try after a break in play. One of their great strengths, however is the ability to respond. The half time message had been ignored and SPC needed to play a more conservative pick and drive style of game. They retrieved the ball not long after the kick and the forwards went to work. Great ball security saw the Ballarat boys' inch toward the line before Chris Debono burst through a faltering Haileybury defence.

The next 20 minutes became a real arm wrestle, one side gaining territory before losing it again. Luke Polmear was kept busy at fullback and Mitch Cattell was kicking the ball well to find touch. St Pats downfall was it's lineout. Too often the home side would kick themselves out of trouble only to lose the ball at the restart. This allowed the visitors most of the possession and territory and St Pats could hold on no longer and eventually Haileybury crossed the line.

With just minutes to play and trailing by 5 points SPC threw caution to the wind and went hard at the Haileybury boys. Haileybury played it safe and kicked at every opportunity to deny St Pats scoring options and when the visitors intercepted a pass and scored late it was game over. Haileybury had hung on and won by 10 points. Haileybury won every lineout in the second half which is a damning stat and something the boys will work hard on at training.

Mr McKee had said all along that this day was about rugby and it's tradition. All players, no matter what age or grade, are expected to act with integrity and be respectful to the opposition and officials. Sharing a meal with the opposition is one of these traditions. SPC players gathered with Haileybury boys and sat down and enjoyed each others company and a couple of stories.
