Year 8 Pastoral Care Group Tutors have been asked to assist and support each student in completing this guide. Students are required to submit their proposed 2019 Year 9 program details using **Web Preferences** (the online subject submission portal). Students will be emailed a link to the Web Preferences log-in, along with detailed instructions. Parents will also be sent a similar email explaining the submission procedure. Please note that a parent and student signed copy of the *2019 Web Preferences Preference Receipt* is to be submitted with this Subject Selection Guide. Students are required to complete the computer entry of their proposed 2019 subject selections before the **Friday, September 7 submission date**. As this is web-based, this can be completed at home or at school.

Section 3 – Core Subjects

All Year 9 students are required to complete the following compulsory Core subjects:

- Religious Education – 6 periods per fortnight
- English – 10 periods per fortnight
- Humanities – 10 periods per fortnight
- Mathematics – 10 periods per fortnight
- Physical Education – 4 periods per fortnight
- Science – 10 periods per fortnight
- Literacy – (with the option to study one of Japanese (VET Cert II in Applied Languages), Linguistics or Literacy Extension) – 8 periods per fortnight
- Rite Journey - 2 periods per fortnight
- Community Service - 2 periods per fortnight
- Pastoral Care – 2 periods per fortnight.

Students study these subjects for the whole year.
